**Message from the Provincial**

***Ignatius of Loyola: Master of Change***

We have just celebrated the feast of our Founder, Ignatius of Loyola. The celebrations were organized with great devotion and spiritual fervour in our communities and institutions. All of us were very enthusiastic and happy on this occasion. In the same spirit, I would now like to invite every member of the province for a serious reflection on our Founder. St. Ignatius was an ambitious person, a self-centred person, a person who looked for his personal glory and satisfaction. But, he was a person who had the courage to look at himself critically and discover himself deeply and own up his strengths and shortcomings. He also had the courage to ask the question, "If others can do so many things for God, why not I?"

That question changed him forever. He gradually gave up his personal ambition, self-centredness, the desire for personal glory and self-satisfaction. Instead, he sought the greater glory of God, the Holy Will of God and worked for the promotion of God's Kingdom. He underwent inner conversion, he changed his entire approach to life, he dedicated himself totally to the service of God and for the promotion of His Kingdom. He did only those things that were for the greater glory of God (AMDG), he went against his own personal likes and desires (*agere contra*), and he always strived for the better and the greater good (*magis*). His inner change and personal conversion led him to discover the Spiritual Exercises, which in turn changed the lives of hundreds and thousands of people later on. He was indeed a man of change, a change that promotes the greater glory of God, a change that takes one away from one's personal desires or selfish agenda, a change for the better or the greater good. He was indeed a master of change.

Our Holy Founder invites each one of us to look at ourselves courageously and critically and discover our inner movements, attitudes, aspirations, desires,

ambitions, etc. He invites us to make a radical change in our personal life for the greater glory of God. He invites us to adapt ourselves, personally and collectively, to the changed situations and needs. He challenges us to dare to think out of the box, to experiment with new approaches and new ministries, to take reasonable risks in life, to accept difficult responsibilities and missions.

The sole aim of a loyal disciple is and should be to imbibe deeply the same attitude and approach of his Leader and Master and live accordingly. Ignatius is inviting each one of us to bring about the required inner changes as he himself did and to rededicate ourselves to our mission and ministries as he did in his life time. The best tribute we can give to our Holy Founder is to ask ourselves the same question which he asked himself 500 years ago: "If others can do so many things for God, why not I?"

**Ignatius and witch-hunts.** False allegations and malicious rumors featured large in Jesuit history from St Ignatius' time. He responded to a witch-hunt by facing it down. Because of his focus on the interior life of the individual, he was variously accused of being immoral, a heretic, an Erasmian, a Lutheran, or one of the *Alumbrados*, who claimed private illumination from God. He was imprisoned by the Spanish Inquisition for 42 days in Alcalá and 22 days in Salamanca. The same slanders followed him to Rome, so Ignatius asked the Pope for a formal investigation of all accusations against him, and a judicial sentence. When the judges formally declared him kosher, he asked that the names of his calumniators be suppressed, but had several authentic copies made of the sentence, to be used whenever God's work was threatened by slander (*AMDG Express*).

The year-long dream of launching a new course on *Rights-based Advocacy and Lobbying Strategy for Social Change* became a reality for IDEAS on 9<sup>th</sup> July. **Fr. Sahayaraj**, with the help of experienced trainers, led a group of 20 men and 8 women cadres and animators from Arunthathiyar movements and NGOs into a week-long exercise to learn and cultivate this new approach for their future use. Appropriate to the current political wrangles over the *Samacheer Kalvi*, **Fr. Stephen Martin** screened on 24 July, as the Thedal Arangam's 26<sup>th</sup> show, a documentary film entitled "Enakku Kalvi Illaiya?" directed by Bharathi Krishnakumar. It was meant to help 36 Sisters and students to analyse the existing educational system in Tamil Nadu.

On 27 and 28 July, **Fr. L. R. Michael Raj** helped the lay staff members from 7 out of our 13 social centres, to reflect on their life experiences and be informed about social action ministry in the Province. Subsequent to the seminar on *Panchayat Raj* conducted by SAPI (South Asian People's Initiatives) on 27 June at which nearly 40 State level leaders and representatives from various Dalit and Tribal organisations participated, the Social Action Coordinator, Fr. Michael Raj and TN SAPI Coord. **Mr. Baskaran** came up with an exciting idea – to train potential candidates for the upcoming panchayat elections. Accordingly, a workshop was organized on

17 July at IDEAS Centre, Madurai for about 75 candidates planning to jump into the political fray.

The two-day colloquium, annually organized for the religious and priests in social action ministry before Inigo's feast, was held this year on 23 and 24 July. Planned by **Fr Michael Jeyaraj** and conducted by **Fr. Sahayaraj**, the programme had 35 persons reflecting on the theme *Civil Society Today: Challenges perceived and Responses envisioned*.
