## **Provincial's Message**

#### Inspirations from the Superior General

Dear Brothers,

During this Lenten Season, we are preparing ourselves spiritually by looking at our personal life, inner disposition and spiritual depth. This is a very useful and necessary preparation to receive the grace of the Risen Lord at the time of the Holy Week and more particularly on Easter Sunday. Let us make this inner renewal and spiritual search as seriously as possible.

As we are busy preparing ourselves to receive the grace of the Risen Lord, it will be highly useful and meaningful if we reflect upon some of the inspiring thoughts of our Superior General, Fr. Adolfo Nicolas, which he shared in the JCSA meeting, held at XLRI, Jamshedpur, from February 18 to 23, 2012. His sharing can be summarized as *a clarion call for serious personal and structural renewal and reorientation*.

While speaking about the celebration of the second centenary of the restoration of Society, which will be held in 2014, he emphasized the need for spiritual renewal at the personal and community level, along with other activities and programmes. Thus, according to the mind of our Superior General, the next two years should be used as an opportune moment for all of us to renew ourselves and re-dedicate ourselves in the service of the Lord. The culmination of these personal and community-level renewal efforts should be the celebration of the second centenary of the restoration of the Society in 2014. A Committee will soon be formed to work out the details of this renewal programme.

Father General also spoke about the need for structural renewal and changes. In fact, a Committee appointed by Fr. General has come out with various suggestions for structural changes in the administration of the Society at different levels. These changes will have to be studied at the level of the Assistancy and at the level of each Province. Fr. General suggested to the Provincials to feel free to introduce different structures at the horizontal level and vertical level to make our administration apostolically more effective. He welcomed a variety of creativity and patterns. He also made it clear that all such changes should be solely for the sake apostolic efficacy and expediency, without bringing in any other motive or consideration. In this connection, he informed the Provincials about the structural changes he has already brought about in the Jesuit Curia in Rome. Now we have three Core Secretariats: Secretariat for the Service of Faith, Secretariat for the Promotion of Justice and Secretariat for Collaboration. These three aspects should be reflected and found in all the ministries of the Society. We also need to apply this triple-focus in all our ministries.

Speaking about formation, Father General reiterated the need to realize that every community should be a place of formation. He stated that our testimony or witness is more important than all our works. This is a matter that is very relevant in our context. I invite each community, particularly its superior, to ensure that each community strives to become a place of strong testimony to our religious life — in our relationships, in the way we spend our time, our outside contacts, our outings, our contacts with our lay collaborators and our students, our attitude and disposition towards all those who are in contact with us, etc. What is the level of our witness to

these people? This is a question that each one will have to ask oneself. We should be extremely careful not to become instruments of counter-witness, much worse, scandals to our collaborators, students and others. *All of us need to be fully aware that the way live our life is more important than what we teach or preach or perform.* During this sacred period of Lent, let us reflect seriously how each one can make himself effective witness to the values of Christ and to religious life itself — a life of service, sacrifice, renunciation, transparency, accountability and availability. May the Lord of history help us in this renewal process.

# Report of the General Body Meeting held on 12.02.2012 - Youth Commission

Altogether 10 Jesuits, 5 Religious and 20 youths took part in the event. We began the meeting with Eucharistic celebration presided over by **Fr. Dominic** Savio. In the very 1st session Fr. Philomin Raj explained about the History of **JYMSA**, its main thrust on the unattended youth, the past and the present of the youth Commission of Madurai Province, the context and the new thrust with which the commission is functioning at present and the ongoing search of the commission to make its activities more relevant, productive and meaningful. In his address he made it clear that JYMSA was the outcome of various consultations held at the South Asian level from 1992 and it is a conscious new venture of the South Asian Jesuits to reach out to the unorganized youths. He further pointed out that a separate secretariat for JYMSA started functioning from 1994. To put it in the words of our former General Fr. Kolvanbach, "It is a conscious choice of the South Asian Jesuits to reach out to the unorganized youths". Fr. Philomin Rai further explained to the group about the works presently undertaken by the commission and its methodology. He also highlighted the significant points of the letter written by our Superior General **Fr.** *Adolfo Nicolas* in "Response to the letters Ex Officio: Youth" where Fr. General invites us to understand, facilitate discernment and to accompany the youths while allowing them to grow in their own wisdom and creativity. In the second session the group made a serious attempt to suggest various ways to address the burning issues targeting the unorganized youths today in Tamil Nadu. It was a fruitful exercise where the group came out with many practical suggestions. After lunch the resource person of the day **Mr. Kamaraj**, a member of Tamil Nadu Progressive Writers Forum made an appeal to the commission to make use of our expertise to awaken the spirit of the youths through social education. After his address some of our collaborators presented brief reports about our collaborative ventures in the fields of unorganized youths and women. The presence of Fr. Provincial in the General Body Meeting was encouraging.

#### Provincial's address:

Fr. Provincial, in his address recapitulated the significant suggestions that emerged from the floor. He reiterated the need for great concern about the Society. He pointed out how the children nowadays are growing with more selfish motives and suggested ways to encounter them with LASAC type of initiatives in their respective villages. He further stressed the need for respecting and recognizing women and giving them their due. Fr Provincial acknowledged the importance of this ministry and gave a clarion call to the commission to work along with its collaborators to meticulously plan out and systematically implement the programmes in a fruitful, productive and meaningful manner. Further he accepted the need for a full-time Jesuit along with another full-time assistant to further the scope and thrust of this ministry. He also acknowledged the necessity for a separate scretariat that would cater to the needs of unorganized

youths. Moreover, he expressed his willingness to fund generously for the successful execution of this ministry in the future. He also suggested that the commission must find out ways of bringing the youths under the banner of SHGs similar to women and to inculcate the saving habit. He invited us to have a broader network and collaboration with other religious Congregations and lay groups as it is the policy of our Congregation.

#### A NEW BISHOP FOR DHARMAPURI

The Diocese of Dharmapuri has got a new bishop in the person of the *Most. Rev. Lawrence Pius* who was earlier Auxiliary Bishop of Madras-Mylapore Archdiocese. Bishop Lawrence was installed on 20 Feb. *Frs. A. Arulanandam, Thomas Amirtham* and *Ilanko Xavier* represented the Province at the ceremony and greeted the new Bishop. The celebration was held in a Salesian school campus about ten kilometeres away from Dharmapuri. A sizable crowd of people and about 250 priests were there to honour the new Pastor. The Nuncio also was there apart from the bishops of Tamil Nadu and Puduchery.

The introduction to the celebration noted that the Jesuits were the pioneers in that area too. The history of Christianity in the area of Dharmapuri dates from 1623 when *Fr. Robert de Nobili*, his successors, and later on through the Portuguese Jesuits of Madurai Mission announced the Good News. In 1654 the Italian Jesuits of Mysore had their residence at Dharmapuri and began to preach the Gospel in the region as far as Tirupattur in Vellore District. In 1674, St. John de Britto visited Dharmapuri on his way to Kolei. He stayed with his confreres, being accompanied by *Fr. Antony Ribero*. In 1687, the Mysore Mission was active in the area. May the diocese of Dharmapuri flourish under the guidance of the new Bishop Lawrence!

#### **Father General**

Visit to India. Rev Fr General is visiting the South Asian Assistancy from February 15 to March 1. He is accompanied, as always, by the Regional Assistant, Fr **Lisbert D'Souza**, but also by **Fr. Marcos Recolons**, Regional Assistant for Southern Latin America, also one of the Assistants ad providentiam. As usual, the visit is meant to coincide with a meeting of the Provincials' Conference. Since the venue of the Conference meeting is XLRI, the Management School in Jamshedpur, Fr General will also briefly visit Jamshedpur Province, and the neighbouring Provinces of Ranchi and Hazaribag. This visit will afford Fr General to have his first experience of the Church in the tribal belt of Central India. Arguably, the most vibrant Church in the country is found here. In the tribal belt, perhaps more than in other parts of the Assistancy, efforts at inculturating the liturgy have been effective and well accepted. It is appropriate that Fr Marcos Recolons, who has extensive experience of the indigenous people of Bolivia, should be Fr General's companion on this visit. Hopefully the other major tribal area, that of the North East, will be host to Fr General on a subsequent visit. There are as many as six Jesuit Bishops currently in office in this Central Zone.

An issue that the Conference intends to take up at length, hoping to profit from Fr General's presence, is the final revision of the Conference Statutes. This revision is meant to better reflect the expectations of GC 35 on the nature and scope of Conferences as units of mission

facilitation of the Society locally and universally. There will be three new faces among the Major Superiors at the Conference meeting.

## Fr. Zacharias Pazheparamphil, SJ

(1926-2012)

Fr. Zacharias arrived in our community of St. Joseph's College, Tiruchi on the 19/12/2012 from Eastern African Province where he had been a member and worked for close to four decades. He had taught philosophy in major diocesan seminary in Nyeri-Kenya, built and stocked its library and to his credit he has taught at least 17 bishops and countless

church.

Fr. Zacharias upon his arrival immediately integrated himself into the community and in a few days was up and running, taking walks around the campus, and carrying out errands for himself, such as going for shopping, making calls, writing letters and other tasks.

Though age had caught up with him his spirit was strong. Fr. Zacharias insisted on attending/celebrating Eucharist either in the community chapel or college church where he would concelebrate when it was appropriate. He amazed and inspired the congregation especially when he attended the 5.30 am Mass every day in the College Church. Also, he took his meals in the refectory where he would engage fellow companions both old and young in interesting conversations with clarity of thought and argument.

On the days when he was unable to attend Mass due to illness he longed and always asked to receive communion.

As days passed, however, due to old age his health continued to decline. Eventually it reached a point where he could not walk without support and eventually he was confined to his room. Even though he was bedridden he still wanted to take his usual walks and sometime had to be helped to sit on the veranda outside his room.

From time to time he was admitted to Fatima hospital at Fatima Nagar, Tiruchi for medication but always came back to the community more determined and full of life.

In late January due to lack of mobility and spending most of the time in bed, he developed bedsores and his condition was not that promising. After consultation and prayer, the community through **Fr. John Britto** (Rector) and **Br. Arokiaraj** (Minister) transferred him to St. Joseph's Hospital in Didingul where he continued to receive care and nurse his health. Even in hospital he continued to edify those who met and administered to him.

On the afternoon of Ash Wednesday (22 Feb 2012) at about 3.45 P.M. he finally went to the Lord who had called him. The requiem Mass and burial took place in Besch Illam at 4 P.M. on  $23^{\rm rd}$  Feb 2012. It was an occasion to celebrate a life well lived in the service of the Church and the people of God especially in East Africa and Kenya in particular.

His fellow companions from his last community of St. Joseph's College, Tiruchi, Beschi Illam, other religious congregations, and his family members came to bid farewell to a great missionary. **Sch. Ken Ogot** read the message from the Provincial of East African Province. **Fr M. Devadoss** delivered the funeral oration. Though his wish of dying in Africa was not fulfilled he will always remain a true friend and in the hearts of the people of God in Africa.
