Message from the Provincial

My Mission = God's Mission

Dear Brothers,

Fr. Adolfo Nicolas, our Superior General says: Our mission is God's own mission. When this is applied to each individual personally, it is even more appealing and aweinspiring, namely, I realize that my mission is nothing but the mission of God Himself. It is a great privilege to realize that I am called to take up the responsibility of carrying out His own mission. I feel so small and humble when I think of this unique privilege.

What does this mean in my daily life? Since my God is a God of history and He shapes history, I must also contribute my own little mite to human history and march along with Him in building and guiding history. As God is always with me and comes after me even when I try to go away from Him, I must learn to live in His presence always and should never try to hide

myself from Him. As God loves me unconditionally, I have to love Him and His people unconditionally. As God has sacrificed His only son for my salvation and that of the entire humanity, I must be ready to sacrifice myself to any extent. As God gives Himself to me, I have to give myself to His service. I must realize that my life becomes meaningful and precious to the extent I am able to give myself for the service of God and His mission, which always includes my service to the people of God. I become great by giving and sacrificing and lose everything whenever I try to gain or grab things for myself. What I do in my ministry is immaterial and unimportant, but the attitude with which I do what I am expected to do matters very much, as my inner disposition determines my closeness to God and His mission.


At this time of Lent, when we are preparing for the great feast of Easter, the realization that "my mission" is identical with "God's mission" is a rich spiritual experience and this truth should go deep into each one of us. In addition,

our response to the voluntary resignation of the Holy Father, should be one that deepens our faith, increases our sense of detachment, urges us to commit ourselves to a selfless service to the mission of God. Speaking about this historical event, our Father General has said in his communication, dated February 12, 2013: "We receive this announcement of the Holy Father with respect and admiration for his spiritual freedom, his humility, and his deep love for the Church". Fr. General concludes his communication with the following words: "let us recommit ourselves to the mission, which he [Pope Benedict XVI] has entrusted to the Society". Let this historical event and the Easter Festival in this Year of Faith, be an occasion for a deep and personal spiritual renewal and rededication, so that we are enabled to carry out God's own mission in our daily life.

BR DEVADIRAVIAM MARIA ANTONY, SJ

07.08.1933 - 27.01.2013

Hailing from a traditionally Catholic family of Alagappapuram in Thoothukudi District, Br Devadiraviam Tamil Nadu. joined the Society



of Jesus at the age of 23. After his novitiate at Beschi, Dindigul, he was sent to Dr Meuller's Hospital, Mangalore for practical training in nursing. He was one of the few who were sent there from the Madurai Province. After this training course he became the infirmarian at St. Joseph's College, Trichy and Manalur estate. For many years, he was the infirmarian at St. Mary's School, Madurai where he proved himself to be a man for others. Always cheerful and jovial, he made others happy. His practical jokes cheered the sick. His motto was to be always happy and make others also happy.

But many would not know how he managed to be always happy and cheerful. He took copious notes from the spiritual books that he read and retreat talks that he heard, underlining the important things that he should remember and work on.

After he came to Beschi Illam in 2004 for complete rest, he was very regular in his religious duties. He celebrated his golden jubilee in 2006. After the jubilee Mass and felicitations, when he addressed the gathering, the audience roared with laughter at his jokes.

Towards the end of December 2012, he had a fall in his room and was admitted to St Joseph Hospital, Dindigul. A host of health problems ensured that he never recovered and he passed away in the early hours of 27 Jan '13. As Fr Provincial was away attending the CRI meeting in Chennai, the funeral Mass was presided over by Fr M.A. Joe Antony, Socius to the Provincial and Frs A Victor and Britto Peter were the concelebrants. Fr Albert Joseph delivered the funeral homily and Fr A. Victor gave the final blessing, after which Br Devadiraviam was laid to rest at the Beschi cemetery.

NEVER A MOMENT OF SADNESS - EXCEPT ONCE

Search through the catalogues of the Madurai Mission, old and new, and you will not find any European missionary who lived and worked up to the age of a 100 years – except one. That one is Fr Pierre Montaud. He completed his 100th year of life on 1 Sept 1989. Fr Pierre's younger brother, Clement, also joined the Society of Jesus and became a priest of the Madurai Mission. Fr Clement Montaud passed away at Dindigul on 20 Dec 1980 at the age of 86. Maurice Montaud, the brother next to Pierre, had served the French army as a colonel for many years. He was given the award 'Legion of Honour' and in the birthplace of the Montauds, a street has been named 'Rue de Montaud'. Reviewing his long missionary life in the Madurai Mission, old and new, longer than that of any other priest-missionary down from De Nobili, Fr Montaud reminisces that in all his life in India he had never experienced any moment of sadness - except once, when his beloved mother, in her last days, tried to get Fr General's permission for him to visit her. He was not allowed to do so, still "the good Fr Varaprasadam", to quote Fr Pierre, graciously sent him and his brother Clement home for six months in 1968, long after their mother's death. - Frs S.
