Dear Brothers.

It is indeed a moment of joy for all of us in India, as **Blessed Mother Teresa** has been elevated to the status of a **Saint**. Many of us have seen her, a good number of us have met her personally, a few of us would have even interacted with her and received her blessings. At this moment all of us can justifiably feel proud that someone known so much to us is elevated to the status of a Saint.

Mother Teresa was fragile physically but very strong in her deep faith in God. After leaving her Congregation, she jumped into the dark, looking for light and direction. She found light and direction in the darkness, because what appeared to be dark for her as a human being, proved to be the right direction and a sure source of light and true joy. She found her real joy in the gutters, on the road sides, in garbage cans. She found her life's fulfillment by serving the most neglected and the most unwanted men, women and babies. Her faith in God was so deep that she would not hesitate to do anything, which may sound or appear impossible from a human point of view. She had the true spirit of a pioneer, taking risks and facing obstacles, amidst loneliness and helplessness.

us, to have had the opportunity to know her, or meet her or to have interacted with her.

Another fragrance of saintliness has now come to our door steps. We are proud that one



of our own province-men, Fr. Louis Leveil, SJ, has been declared a **Servant of God** by the Holy See. Our people, particularly in the districts of Ramnad and Sivagangai remember him fondly, with great respect and love. He was a man of deep commitment. He was the one who, as a novice. asked permission from his Superiors in France: "Please allow me to go India to work there and to die there". As per his desire, he was sent to India, he worked in our soil and he died in our soil. Now we are glad that he has been declared a Servant of God.

May St Teresa be a true source of inspiration to each one of us – in our life, in our mission, in our faith in the Lord of history, in our commitment to the service of the poor, the marginalized, the Dalits – the people of our option. May the Servant of God, Fr. Louis Leveil, the holy man, who walked, toiled and soiled his hands and feet mainly in the mission fields of Sivagangai and Ramnad, be a source of spiritual strength to all of us as we prepare ourselves for GC36, which will review seriously our life and mission and take steps to renew our governance system to suit modern needs and challenges.

Celebrations, Functions, Courses...

Meticulous planning and direction of Fr. Albert William, the president of Sports of our college made the 47th Sports Day of **AAC**, Karumathur, held on 24 Aug '16 a memorable one. CIS, Beschi and the Spirituality and Dialogue Commission organized a 5-day course on "the Dynamics of the Ignatian Spirituality" on 01-05 Aug by Fr Pavul Raj, Gregorian University. On 15 Aug Beschi celebrated joyfully the Jubilees of Frs John Meepillikavi and Arockiaraj and Br I. Antony. On 26 Aug before the community gathered for a group photograph in front of the statue of Beschi, Fr Amaldas (DEL), garlanded the saintly scholar's statue. Recovering from the serious injuries he suffered in a road accident, Amal went to Delhi for his Last Vows and has returned to resume his studies at Gandhigram.

At **Carmel** School, Nagercoil, **Bishop Jerome Das** of Kuzhithurai was the Chief Guest at the Sports Day celebrations.

Fr Jerry, Dhyana Ashram, gave a 30 minute presentation on St Ignatius in Madha TV and 3 talks on the Jubilee of Mercy in Jaya Plus TV. He gave 2 sessions on leadership for Provincials of different congregations at NBCLC, Bangalore. **Fr. Anand Amaladoss**, on the occasion of 'Madras Week 2016' organized two lectures on "Chennai History through Architectural Styles" and "Jesuits' Participation in Chennai History" on 19, 20 Aug.

















In France: Sch. Sathyabalan did his Pre-Ordination Programme last month, with 11 other scholastics from 8 different provinces. Sch. Vasanthakumar took part in the 12-day MAGIS programme, organized by the Polish Jesuits and attended by 2000 youth. It had a range of 'Ignatian Experiments' in various fields like Faith and Culture, Social Service, Arts, Ecology etc. Mixed groups of youth from different countries were sent out on their experiments where they learnt to encounter God in their daily chores of life. He attended also the World Youth Day celebrations at Krakow, Poland, on 14-31 July. Schs. Annaraj and Michael Panimaya Raj have just finished their two months of intensive French learning and are now all set to begin the new academic year.

Fr M.S. Jacob, ICRDCE, was the Chief Guest at the First Graduation Ceremony of Andavan Community College, Arakonam and called on the students to become ambassadors for the Community College System in India through their character and competence.

IDCR organized a National Seminar on 28-30 July on "Religions in Society in India Today" with 15 paper presenters and respondents. The rich interaction between participants flowered in a Statement that stressed social harmony amidst fundamentalism and violence.

Province's **Higher Education Commission (HEC)** and IACHE, New Delhi and Xavier Board organized the Tamil Nadu Convention of Catholic, Christian and Muslim Colleges at St Joseph's, Trichy on 12 Aug. More than 125 participants from 37 Colleges deliberated on NEP Draft and sent their response to MHRD. **Frs. Pushparaj and Xavier Alphonse** were invited by the Andhra Jesuit Province to initiate a discussion on NEP on 25 Aug in which 230 participants from 60 institutions from all over Andhra and Telegana took part.



JCERT, in collaboration with SEC and Tamil Nadu Science Forum, brought together on 30 July at Loyola, Chennai around 800 participants from 23 organizations of college and school teachers for a seminar on NEP and further planning of action programmes that will conscientize more people on the dangers of the proposed NEP. Fr John Kennedy of JCERT spoke to 200 educationists on NEP on 13 Aug at Christu Raja School, Palayamkottai and on 20 Aug to the 108 HMs of the Coimbatore Presentation Sisters.

Two JRS staff, Ms Jane from Czech Republic and Ms Cathy from England, visited **JRS-TN** office. They helped in documentation and trained JRS staff and Girihini students at Mullaikudi.

Fr Anto writes from London: "From the day I landed in London I was with the two men from our province, Fr Richard and Sch Thayriam, who were conducting a summer camp for the youth of St. Anselm's Parish. More than 70 students participated and I could see how effectively our two dynamic men established a rapport with the students and encouraged them to develop their skills and talents. The two welcomed me and made me feel at home. When Richard left for India from Heathrow airport almost the entire youth group was there to say goodbye. It was a moving scene."

Loyola College of Education (LCE) bade farewell to Dr Rajakumari Amirthagowri, who was its Principal for the past four years and welcomed the new Principal, Dr Kulandai Theresal, who assumed office on 01 Aug. Something new, something good ...

Amuthu, St Mary's, Dindigul, has conducted cultural programme in 35 villages to create social awareness. It has conducted coaching classes for candidates for Group 3 and 4 jobs.

'Velicham Kalaikuzhu' - an initiative of **JESIM**, AHAL, performed its first awareness programme in Solankunam, an Irular village on 13 Aug. To help Irular youth use their talents and form a cultural troupe JESIM organized a training programme for them in Tindivanam. 'Velicham', an Irular volleyball team' participated in the Chennai Mission silver jubilee memorial tournament organized by Loyola College, Vettavalam. Animators of Irular villages had a one-day workshop learning how to apply for community certificates, old age pension and widows' pension.

Ten **French students** built three houses in Kilpennathur parish, staying at AHAL for a month.

On 08 Aug the renovation of St John Berchmans (Superior's) block of **Beschi** commenced with the ground-breaking ceremony at which Fr Provincial said a prayer. On 17 Aug **representatives of the three communities in Dindigul** attended the blessing of the renovated house of Mr Jeyaram, who has been the hairdresser to our three communities in Dindigul for a very long time. The cost was borne by the three communities. **Fr Selvanayagam**, the Province Treasurer, unveiled the commemorative stone, **Fr Joe Mike** cut the ribbon and opened the house, and **Fr Leo Tagore** blessed the house.

K. Satheesh, a student of **Carmel,** Nagercoil, has won the State-level Taekwondo championship.

Dhyana Ashram has begun to focus on a particular theme each month. Last month's focus was on Pope Francis's *The Joy of Love* on which Fr Jerry has published a booklet (*See 'New Books'*)

ICRDCE, Chennai has selected seven trainers for the English Access Program sponsored by U.S. Consulate. 150 students have been selected to undergo this English Access Microscholarship Program for the next 2 years.

Province **Secondary Education Commission** (SEC) and **JCERT** played a role in bringing together 23 organizations of professors and teachers, which formed a federation for the protection of education rights (Kalvi Urimai Paathukaapu Koottamaipu).



















On 17 Aug 2016, **JMAADD**, Nagercoil, has duly been licensed as De-addiction cum Rehabilitation Centre by the Institute of Mental Health, Chennai. The license is valid till 16 Aug 2021. With this licence, JMAADD has moved a notch higher in its quest for professionalism. Since April, 2016, 144 alcoholics have been treated in 6 camps, 5194 school and college students have been given an alcohol awareness programme, 83 group meetings have been held, 218 families have been visited and 2894 persons have been contacted over phone for recovery support.

JRS-TN organized interface meetings with 87 Government officials in 5 districts - Dindigul, Tiruvannamalai, Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri and Kanyakumari. These meetings gave the people in Sri Lankan Refugee Camps a rare opportunity to express their grievances. The interface has been an effective advocacy tool, as many of their grievances have been addressed and their demands met. It has also strengthened the liaison between the Government officials and the JRS team.

On 27 Aug the Coimbatore chapter of **Loyola Alumni Association** was inaugurated. Mr A.K.Vishwanathan, the Additional DGP Of Police, was the Chief Guest. **Fr Thomas Amirtham**, Director, invited the alumni to visit Loyola and participate in every campus activity.

Guided by the Rector, Fr Jayapathy, **LIBA** administration has been revamped by **Fr M.J. Christie**, Director, with a new organizational structure. **Fr Maria Wenisch** is now the Dean - Administration. For the past two months the LIBA faculty have been undergoing marathon strategic planning exercises with the intention of making LIBA one of the top business schools in the country. LIBA has taken the lead in starting an 'Incubation Centre' at LIBA premises in order to help social entrepreneurs successfully launch their social enterprises. It has taken a new avatar as the CSR initiative of LIBA to impart employment skills to the underprivileged and the refugees and to assist the small and tiny entrepreneurs among them to succeed in their enterprises.

In this year's Bertram Tournament **LCAS** (Loyola College of Arts & Sciences), Chennai won the Volleyball shield after a gap of nine years. In basketball they ran a close second. Loyola retained the overall championship of the tournament.

Nearly 5,000 students from all over Tamil Nadu attended on 27 Aug a Technical Symposium organized by **LICET**, and LICET students won the first place in the paper contest on Smart Home Control using IOT. A team of LICET students has been selected for the next level competition in all terrain vehicle design. Abbasudin, a third year student of

(From the memoirs of Mr Francois Martin, the Frenchman who became the first Governor of Pondicherry)

The Very Reverend Father John Britto belonged to a noble family, and had in his youth been brought up with King Pedro. However as God destined him to a higher position than he could ever have attained in that court by his own merit, he joined the Reverend Jesuit Fathers, and a few years later, impelled by his zeal and piety, he sailed to India, in spite of great opposition both from his noble mother and relatives, and from King Pedro himself. Shortly after reaching Goa, he entered the famous Madura Mission, which was in so flourishing a condition, owing to the blessings which Heaven bestowed on the zeal and fervor of so many illustrious missionaries, who had been laboring in it ever since it was founded by the Reverend Father Robert de Nobili in the year 1606.

Father John de Britto, having spent fourteen or fifteen years in that laborious work, and having achieved a surprising success in the conversion of several thousands of people in the land of the Maravas, where so far no missionary had penetrated, the brahmans accused the Reverend Father before the Nayak or lord of the country. He was therefore arrested, imprisoned, ill-treated, several times beaten, and on the point of crowning his beautiful life with martyrdom. He was snatched, however, from the clutches of death, set free, driven out of the Marava land, and forbidden to return thither, under pain of death.

Years later I was chagrined to find out that this phrase was not about Mary at all. But somehow it has stayed with me, and now it seems to have more truth than ever.

Mary - a contrary lady, certainly - has been made into the image of opposites: mother, ever-virgin, yet neither mother or virgin as anyone else would experience those states of being.

Mary, Mary, how does your garden grow? These days her garden is in trouble through pollution, the devastation of war, bombs, stockpiled nuclear weapons, lands burned into desert by greed and economic systems that serve only to encourage consumerism, cities barely inhabitable, a thinning ozone layer, and waters and ground poisoned by chemicals and radioactivity. It is a garden that is fast losing some of its best plants and creatures, with ancient trees felled, and the escalating demise of endangered species. The children have forgotten how to be gardeners of food for survival (justice) and cultivators of beauty (mercy).
